

# Viktor Bannikov

Viktor Bannikov was born on April 28, 1938 in the village Lugyny of Zhytomyr region.

He began his journey in football as a goalkeeper of a factory team in Zhytomyr in 1957. He had an exceptional reaction and played reliably on the pitch line.

Player career: "Avanhard" Zhytomyr (1959), "Shakhtar" Korosten (1960), "Desna" Chernihiv (1960-61), "Dynamo" Kyiv (1961-69), "Dnipro" Dnipropetrovsk (1970), "Torpedo" Moscow (1970-73).

Bannikov played 258 matches (151 - for "Dynamo" Kyiv) in the championships of the USSR. He was USSR Champion in 1967 and 1968, silver medalist in 1965 and USSR Cup winner in 1964, 1966 and 1972.

Viktor Bannikov was honored as a Master of Sports of the USSR (1991). He was the best goalkeeper of the Soviet Union in 1964 and 1970.

He was included to the list of "33 best" for the five times, he leaded the ranking in 1970, then was the second in 1964 and 1971, and took


the third place in 1965 and 1972. He was the member of the symbolic Club of Lev Yashin for his 138 clean sheet matches. He didn't concede goals over a period of 1122 minutes in a row in the 1967-68. This achievement was a record for the USSR championships. He spent nine games in European tournaments. Viktor Bannikov played 14 matches (1964-1966, 1970-1972) for the USSR national team.

Bannikov was the goalkeeper of the Soviet National Team which took 4<sup>th</sup> place on the World Cup 1966. He was a participant of qualifying matches for Euro-1972.

He became a head coach of "Zorya" Luhansk in 1976. In 1977-78 he worked as a head coach of "Spartak" Zhytomyr. Viktor Bannikov was appointed to be a coach of the Ukrainian SSR.

In 1991-96 he was elected as the president of the Football Federation of Ukraine, then he was its first vice-president from 1996 to 2001. He was awarded the Emerald UEFA Order "For Merit", FIFA and UEFA gold marks awards.

Viktor Bannikov died on April, 25, 2001.



# XV International Viktor Bannikov Memorial tournament



Ukraine will burst into the festive atmosphere of youth football at the end of the summer. Our country will host seven national teams under 17 from different European countries. During five days, from August 15 to 19, they will delight Ukrainian fans with interesting and uncompromising football. After all, the main target is an honorary cup of prestigious competition which is named after the legendary goalkeeper of Dynamo Kyiv and the



first president of the Football Federation of Ukraine Viktor Bannikov.

The national teams under 17 from Ukraine, Georgia, Belarus, Lithuania, Israel, Slovakia, Turkey and Latvia will take part in the XV International Youth Tournament in memory of the first head of the national federation. 16 matches among which there are 12 games of the group stage and 4 final stage matches will be held at four football arenas of the Kyiv region s. a. Bannikov stadium in Kyiv, Melnyk Stadium in Obuhiv, "Kolos" in Boryspil and "Kniazha Arena" in Shchaslyve.

By the way, unlike the last year's tournament, this year the stadium "Yuvileinyi" in Bucha is replaced by the stadium near the FFU Football House, named after the first president of the Football Federation Viktor Bannikov, where the final match will be held.

It is noteworthy that this year tournament will be held in August, not in May as it was the previous years. The reason is that the tournament changed its status into the completion for 17 years old players while it was for 16-year-olds before. Despite the fact that for the first Viktor Bannikov Memorial tournament took place in Ukraine in 2002, the modern format of the competition with the involvement of the youth teams has been used only for four years. Poland was



the first winner of the tournament when four youth teams played to each other without final matches.

After that, the Bannikov Memorial was held in a scenario well-known to all the football fans. The teams are divided into two groups of four teams each and the groups winners compete for the main prize. The most frequent cup winners were Ukraine boys, who got five times (2003, 2005, 2006, 2011, 2012). Turkish national team won three times (2004, 2007, 2013). It is interesting that the team of Russia, which suffered four defeats in decisive matches (2002, 2011-2013), still remains the failure "champion". They still haven't won the trophy. Bronze awards were also given most often to Ukrainians who had won four play-offs for the third place (2002. 2009, 2010, 2013).



Last year, Giorgia national team won Viktor Bannikov Memorial tournament for the second time in a row. As in 2016, the "crusaders" defeated the national team of Israel in the final match. Ukraine national team beat Slovak peers in the match for the third place. The Estonians which beat Latvia national team were the fifth ones. The seventh place was won by boys from Slovenia who defeated Belarusians. In addition, individual awards were given to the best players:

The Bannikov Memorial that has become the true epicenter of football battles for youth teams wasn't held in 2014 and 2015 because of the volatile socio-political situation in Ukraine. The resumption of the competition in 2016 gave the fans a million of unforgettable moments and fun from the high level skill of future football stars and the incredible intrigue in the fight for the prize.



## TOURNAMENT REGULATIONS

## Dates and venues

Dates of the Tournament are from 14 to 20 August 2018.

Tuesday, 14 August is day of arrival for all participators.

Monday, 20 August is day of departure for all participators.

The tournament will be played in the city of Kyiv and Kyiv region.

## **Participators**

Eight National Youth Teams shall take part in the Tournament Belarus, Lithuania, Israel, Georgia, Latvia, Slovakia, Turkey and Ukraine.

## Match system

Teams shall form two groups of four teams — A and B. Each team plays against the other team in the same group using the league system.

## Determination of the group winner

The team which obtains the greater number of points in the group matches is placed first in the group. Three points are awarded for a win and one point for a draw.

If two or more teams are equal on points after playing all the matches in the group the following criteria are applied to determine the ranking in the order given:

- The greater number of points from the matches among the teams in question.
- Goal difference resulting from the matches among the teams in question (teams having the same number of points).
- The greater number of goals scored among the teams in question (teams having the same number of points).
- d. Goal difference from all matches played in the group.
- The greater number of goals scored in all matches played in the group.
- f. Fair Play ranking in all matches of the group.
- g. Drawing of lots by the Organizing Committee.

## Play-off matches

The teams to play the play-off matches shall be determined in the following way:

## match for the seventh place:

fourth team of group A versus fourth team of group B:

## match for the fifth place:

third team of group A versus third team of group B;

## match for the third place:

runner up of group A versus runner up of group B;

## final match:

winner of group A versus winner group B.

If, upon completion of the normal playing time, the play-off matches end in a draw or the teams have not scored goals, kicks from the penalty mark shall determine the winning team according to the «Laws of the Game» (2015/2016 edition). No extra time will be given.

## **Duration of the matches**

All matches shall be played in two periods of 40 min. Interval between the periods shall be not more than 15 min.

## Substitutions

Every team in each match is permitted to do **9 (nine)** substitutions, but only **three** stops of the game is allowed in the second period in order to do substitutions. Substitutions are performed for the players who are listed in the official match report. Not more than 20 players have to be listed on the match sheet.

## Disciplinary sanctions

The player who receives two yellow cards shall be suspended for the next match. The player who receives the red card is automatically suspended for the next match. The Organizing Committee shall take a decision on the further participation of the player in the Tournament...

## Refereeina

Refereeing of the tournament matches is committed according to the «Laws of the Game» (present edition 2016/17) if otherwise is not stipulated in the Tournament Regulations.

Referees and their assistants, appointed by the FFU's Referee Committee, shall serve the matches.

## Protests and appeals

Protests and appeals are to be presented to the Organizing Committee. The decisions taken by the Committee are final and binding. The Committee shall not consider protests for decisions taken by the Referees.

## Unforeseeable consequences

The matters not stipulated in the Regulations shall be considered by the Organizing Committee. The Organizing Committee will adopt the final decision in accordance with FIFA's practice and FAIR-PLAY and RESPECT principles.
